LOAD BALANCING

In July 2008 Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger signed legislation that increased the limit on the load an adjunct faculty member could teach, from 60 percent to 67 percent of a fulltime instructor's load. This translates to 20 units per year. As the YC-AFT board understands it, this equals 10 units per semester. However, the district administration has interpreted load balancing differently. Therefore, we are seeking legal counsel about this disagreement.
